July 6 You Know Me (Psalm 139):

Was there a time when you were filled with so many emotions – confusion, frustration, sadness, and joys? In **Psalm 139**, David takes a step back, looks back on his own life, and reflects on how God is.

July 13 <u>A Psalm for a Weary Heart (Psalm</u>

23): In Israel's perspective, calling God a shepherd was not a grand or glorious image. Back then, shepherds weren't respected in their economic and social hierarchy. David calls the Lord as his **shepherd** – what did he mean by that?

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

July was a busy month for several construction projects at CECC. We are truly blessed and appreciate the work being done by the **Building Committee**.

The Wheelchair Lift platform has been installed but remains pending approval until inspections are completed by TSSA and ESA. Additional safety work is required to ensure the platform meets all permit requirements.

We aim to begin recruitment and training for operating the Wheelchair Platform by **late August** or **early September.** Construction of the ramp is scheduled to start in mid-August.



The Washroom in the foyer is now finally accessible, with the automatic door installed and functional. The exterior automatic door is still in progress. The opening in the Vestry attic is done. Work will continue once we receive the Electric Ladder.
